FAMILY COUNSELLING CENTER (FCC)

With the support of State Social Welfare Board, Government of Odisha, SEHADA has established FamilyCounseling Centre to provide moral, legal, counseling& referral support to women victims of atrocities. Establishment in the year 1999-2000 and it serves the entire district of Jharsuguda.

What does Family Counseling involve?



- Each family member's view of the situation and their needs are discussed. Unhelpful and helpful patterns of interaction are identified. The counselor helps the family work towards common goals.
- The family is a system of which each individual member is a part of. Therefore, an individual's behavior is influenced by how the family functions.
 The counselor helps family members communicate with one other effectively, develop skills to resolve issues faced and enhance their relationships with each other.

During the reporting period different type of cases received and provided counseling, shelter, vocational training legal and moral support by FCC.

SWADHAR GREH

Victims of domestic violence, sexual assault, unwed mother, trafficking, widow and economic crisis have a place to turn to help in SWADHAR home. SWADHAR has flexible and innovative approach to cater to the requirement of various types of women in distress in diverse situations under different conditions. More specifically it caters to the requirements of the women in distress as regards primary need, shelter, medical, emotional support, counseling, rehabilitation, clinical, and legal support.

Our Mission:

Safe Shelter is committed to empowering victims of physical, emotional, and sexual violence by offering information which will allow them to choose their own courses of action and by supporting them as they act on those choices. We are further committed to educating the public on the issues surrounding domestic and sexual violence so that together we may challenge societal



attitudes which condone the use of violence as a means of gaining and maintaining power and control over another person.

Our Philosophy:

Safe Shelter is dedicated to the conviction that all people are entitled to live in safety, free of the incidence of violence. As guiding principles, we believe:

- in respect for the dignity and equality of the individual
- that everyone has the right to self-determination
- in fairness and good faith in working with individuals
- that individuals should not be discriminated against in any respect
- in respect for the confidential nature of personal information
- that people should have access to the resources and services they need

- To aid in the prevention of dating violence and date rape by distributing materials appropriate for adolescents and young adults.

CHILDLINE

With the support of CHILDLINE INDIA FOUNDATION (A project of Ministry of Women and Child Development, Govt. of India) SEHADA has taken responsibilities to run CHILDLINE services as a Collaborative organization at Jharsuguda district from 15th March 2016.

The objects and mission statement of CIF and CHILDLINE

CHILDLINE is India's first 24-hour, toll free, emergency phone outreach service for children in need of care and protection linking them to long-term services for their care and rehabilitation. Any child and concerned adult can call 1098 and access the CHILDLINE service any time of the day or night.

Vision

A child-friendly nation that guarantees the rights and protection of all children.

Mission

CHILDLINE will reach out to every child in need and ensure their rights and protection through the 4 Cs:

- ➤ Connect through technology to reach the 'last mile'.
- > Catalyze systems through active advocacy.
- ➤ Collaborate through integrated efforts between children, the state, civil society corporate and community to build a child friendly social order
- > Communicate to make child protection everybody's priority

Objectives of CHILDLINE 1098

To reach out to every child in need of care and protection by responding to emergencies on 1098 and by physically reaching out to children.

- i) To adapt and integrate telecommunication technology, linking all districts to the service of 1098, and making it available to all children in need of care and protection.
- ii) To provide a platform of networking amongst organizations and to provide linkages to support systems that facilitates the rehabilitation of children in need of care and protection.
- iii) To work together with the Allied Systems (Police, Health Care, Juvenile Justice, Transport, Legal, Education, Communication, Media, Political and the Community) to create child friendly systems.
- iv) To advocate for services for children that are inaccessible, non-existent or inadequate.

SWABHIMAN HOME

SEHADA is running the Swabhiman Home with the support of District Mineral Foundation Trust, Jharsuguda.

The objectives of the home

- ➤ To provide safe shelter to destitute female and male of Jharsuguda district with dignity
- ➤ To provide vocational training for self sustainable and counselling them to reintegration
- ➤ To provide counselling, police assistance and legal support for destitute male and female
- > To medical support to destitute male and female



In the last year total 68destitute women& their 30children were admitted among 104women & their 31 children were rehabilitated with their family.

Presently, 19 destitute women along with their 09 children are staying at Swabhiman home.

FIT FACILITY CENTRE UNDER SWABHIMAN HOME

SEHADA is running the Fit Facility Centre under Swabhiman Home with the support of District Mineral Foundation Trust, Jharsuguda. The project will be tie up with Swabhiman Home as per declared by Child Welfare Committee, Jharsuguda.

a) To cater to the primary need of shelter, food, clothing, counseling, medical treatment and care and protection of the sexually abused girls in age group of 12-18 years.



- b) To enable them to regain their emotional strength that gets hampered due to their encounter with unfortunate circumstances.
- c) To provide them with legal aid and guidance to enable them to take steps for their readjustment in family/society.
- d) To rehabilitate them economically and emotionally.
- e) To act as a support system that understands and meets various requirements of girls in distress and difficult circumstances.

In the last year total 9 girl child were admitted and 11 girl child were restored with their family.

ONE STOP CENTRE (SAKHI)

One Stop Centre (Sakhi) was inaugurated by Additional District Magistrate Pradeep Kumar Sahu on dated 07th November 2019 at four floor of District Head Quarter Hospital, Jharsuguda in the presence of CDMO,DSWO,PO,Chairperson and members CWC,ADMO,District Bar council president,DCPO,Centre Coordinator District CHILDLINE, Railway CHILDLINE,SuperitendentSwadharGreh and Swabhiman



Home and other government officials, social activist and media personnel.

With the support of Ministry of Women and Child Development, Govt. of India, SEHADA has taken responsibilities to run One Stop Centre (SAKHI) at Jharsuguda district.

About One Stop Center (Sakhi)

One Stop Centre (OSC) is intended to support women affected by violence, in private and public spaces, within the family, community and at the workplace. Women facing physical, sexual, emotional, psychological and economic abuse, irrespective of age, class, caste, education status, marital status, race and culture will be facilitated with support and redressal.



Aggrieved women facing any kind of violence due to attempted sexual harassment, sexual assault, domestic violence, trafficking, honour related crimes, acid attacks or witch-hunting who have reached out or been referred to the OSC will be provided with specialized services.

OBJECTIVES

The objectives of the Scheme are:

- > To provide integrated support and assistance to women affected by violence, both in private and public spaces under one roof.
- ➤ To facilitate immediate, emergency and non-emergency access to a range of services including medical, legal, psychological and counselling support under one roof to fight against any forms of violence against women.

TARGET GROUP

The OSC will support all women including girls below 18 years of age affected by violence, irrespective of caste, class, religion, region, sexual orientation or marital status. For girls below 18 years of age, institutions and authorities established under Juvenile Justice (Care and Protection of Children) Act, 2000 and the Protection of Children from Sexual Offences Act, 2012 will be linked with the OSC.

Block and District Level Meeting for Women's Development

Women's development and women's welfare is the prime activities of the organization. Through the women's meeting, women issues has been decreasing. Women are fighting for their rights.5 block level women meeting were organized. 3500 women had actively participated in this meeting and they also planned to overcome the issues.

Gender Sensitive GPDP Training Programme and Financial Management Training Programme

SEHADA had conducted the Gender Sensitive Grampanchayat Development Plan Training Programme for Planning Unit of all Gram Panchayat of Jharsuguda district. Total 610 participants attended in this training programme. In 20 batches. SEHADA also conducted the Financial Management Training Programme for Sarapanch and Panchayat Executive Officer of all Grampanchayat of Jharsuguda. Total 121 Sarapanch and Panchayat Executive Officer had participated in this programme in 3 batches. The programme was supported



by Panchatiraj and drinking water department, Government of Odisha.

Celebration of International Women's Day 2020

On dated 8th March 2020, International women's Day held at Gangadhar Meher Kalyan Mandap, Jharsuguda. The programme was organized by District Administration in collaboration
